



Preoperative steps

Consider discontinue of antiplatelets and anticoagulants usage	Slide 1
1 week prior: Steroids eye drops and YAG iridotomy	Slide 2
15-30 minutes prior: apply lopidine 0.1% or similar and Pilocarpine 2%	Slide 3

Consider discontinue of antiplatelets and anticoagulants usage

• Antiplatelets and anticoagulants discontinuation should favorably be considered based on the patient's medical condition.

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l week prior - Steroids eye drops and YAG iridotomy

- Steroids eye drops 2-4 times a day in addition to current medication. This to get a quiet eye and avoid SC bleeding.
- YAG iridotomy to phakic patients in the intended quadrant. Can be done also on the surgery day.

15-30 minutes prior: apply lopidine 0.1% or similar and Pilocarpine 2%

- Apply lopidine 0.1% drops or a similar vasoconstrictor with a strong effect on the blood vessels and only mild mydriatic effect. This, to constrict blood vessels and avoid SC bleeding.
- Apply Pilocarpine 2% to stretch the iris and make maximum room for the device in the angle and constrict the pupil to obtain maximum protection to the lens.
